We are now three weeks into the final term of this academic year. As always, the final term is busy with national examinations, proms, sports day, transition visits for new Year 7s and Year 12s and much more!

# Final GCSE, AS and A-Level Examinations

Before the proms there are of course the national examinations for students in Years 11, 12 (AS) and 13. Students in these year groups have begun the final countdown to their examinations and we have already shared a great deal of information with those year groups and families about the process. Final examinations begin on Thursday 9<sup>th</sup> May and will continue for six weeks. The examination contingency days this year are the afternoons of the 6<sup>th</sup> and 13<sup>th</sup> June and all day on the 26<sup>th</sup> June; families with examination students are strongly advised to avoid making any plans until after this date. # Year 10 Progress Evening

We have trialled opening appointments at 12pm midday, however, for the Year 10 Progress Evening we will follow the example of some local schools and open appointments at 7am. Colleagues will be in school from 7.30am to address any problems or issues.

# Endcliffe Park

We have made aware of some unpleasant incidents in Endcliffe Park and the surrounding areas where individuals/groups have approached young people with the intent to intimidate and to steal phones, earphones, etc. The advice from the Police is that if young people intend to go to the park they remain in groups with their friends and to stay in well-lit and well populated areas.

# Ofsted's 'Big Listen'

#### The following information is from Ofsted:

'This survey is from Ofsted. It is for children of primary and secondary school age (up to 18 years old).

Our job is to check that you get the best possible education and that you are kept safe. We do that by visiting schools, colleges, children's homes, nurseries and many other organisations to check on how well they are helping you.

An Ofsted visit can last a few days. Inspectors will talk to staff and children to find out what's going on in the school, care home, nursery or other organisation. In a school, this will involve sitting in lessons and finding out what is taught at the school. The inspector will also check that the school, care home, nursery or other organisation is meeting rules that the government has set. At the end of an inspection, the inspector will write a report about it.

We want your help. We are busy asking the whole country how we can improve, with our 'Big Listen'. And we are very keen to hear from you. We want you to have the chance to tell us what you think and how we can do our job better.

# SEND Updates

As many parents will already know, recruitment in education is currently a challenge. We wrote to SEND parents in July 2023 to share the difficulties we faced recruiting Learning Support Assistants. We are delighted to share with you that we now have three new members of staff which make up a full team. Please welcome Ms Farreira de Paula, Ms Wong and Ms Zhand.

The team has reviewed our Student Engagement Plans, that all SEND students have, and will be modifying the layout of these over this term. This will ensure the information within them is clear and simple to access. All Student Engagement Plans will have a broad target that students will be working towards. These plans will be shared with parents and carers via MCAS (My Child At School) by September 2024, allowing you to see and contribute to the information shared with staff at your child's SEND review.

We are also very proud to share that four students have been nominated for achievement awards by their Alternative Provision providers and will be collecting their awards in May at a ceremony in Canon Medical Arena, Sheffield Olympic Legacy Park.

More recently, we welcomed Olivia Blake, MP for Sheffield Hallam, who visited Tapton School on Thursday 25th April to meet with staff, students, and parents to discuss education and SEND provision. We enjoyed the opportunities to talk about the future of education.

#### Personal Development

This half term all students in Key Stage Three will be looking at a variety of different topics. In Year 7 students will be studying families and consent. Work Experience is an important part of the Year 10 Curriculum, and we are delighted to be able to run this again. It is an excellent opportunity for students to gain an understanding of the skills and qualities required by employers and start thinking about their careers in more detail.

Hosting a placement can be great for employers because it provides an opportunity to 'give back' and support a young person, it might find the organisation a great future employee, and it allows existing employees to have experience managing people. #### Joining Sixth Form

This term is always one of the busiest in Sixth Form as we think about those students taking their exams and moving on, and about our new Year 12s preparing to join us. We know these students have quite enough on their minds with GCSE exams, but we just want to highlight two events that are of importance. More information will follow.

#### Sixth Form Induction Week Beginning 24th June

This will be from Monday to Wednesday, with all students in school on the Monday morning and then in for subject sessions over the next few days. This gives them a chance to meet their Form Tutor and their Form, to gain an understanding of how Sixth Form works and to try out the subjects they have chosen. We hope this will support their transition to Sixth Form and ameliorate any concerns. We will hold a meeting for parents and carers on

Tuesday 25<sup>th</sup> June, sharing the information that students will have had on the Monday. This will also be an opportunity for parents and carers to ask any questions they may have.

### Year 12

Our Year 12 students are now focused on the forthcoming Trial Exams, **week beginning 17<sup>th</sup> June**, and preparation for Post-18 Destinations. Students have been learning about effective revision techniques in Form Time and we will share the exam timetable and revision guidance shortly. Please be reminded that the results of the Trial Exams will be used to inform UCAS Predicted Grades.

Many of our Year 12 students are also engaged in AS Levels, details regarding timetables and study leave will be shared via school email.

Parents and carers have received a letter regarding the forthcoming Post-18 Destinations Evening on **7**<sup>th</sup> **May**. I cannot stress how useful this evening is for those of you wishing to support your child as they apply for university, apprenticeships and/or employment. As you will see we have a wide range of providers in attendance and the evening will allow you to fact-find and answer any questions or queries about life after Tapton.

#### Year 13

At this time of year our attention turns inevitably towards the forthcoming A Levels. Our students have engaged in Trial Exams and an Assessment Week, ensuring that they are fully prepared for the challenges that lie ahead. Tracking for the final Assessment Week will be shared on 8<sup>th</sup> May.

Next week we will publish a detailed timetable of revision sessions designed to support students during Exam Leave, which starts from lunchtime on **10<sup>th</sup> May**. We will also share exam timetables after next week's assembly. In addition, students have been learning about effective revision techniques in Form Time and are currently working on a revision timetable in their remaining Personal Development lessons.
