Please read the details for each subject carefully to ensure you are fully prepared for the Assessment Week.

Subject	Assessment	Revision Strategies for this Assessment
English	45 mins Students will receive a mark out of 10 for 10 short answer questions where they must identify the method within the sentences. This will help prepare them for the following, larger task where they will write a piece of persuasive writing inspired by environmental issues. For this section, they will receive a mark out of 90 for content, organisation, spelling, punctuation and grammar. Students will then receive an overall percentage where both will be added together.	The students will be set a homework a week before their assessment and may take their exercise books home with them to look over what we have covered in class and remind themselves of the success criteria. Everything we do in class will build up to the assessment.
Maths	The Year 8 Maths Assessment will be one paper, 45 minutes long. Students will have a yellow sheet in their books containing the list of topics that will be on the	Complete the Mathswatch homework. If you struggle with any of the topics while you are revising, look at your notes and examples in your Maths book. Or you can watch the relevant video on
	assessment. Students will have homework set on Mathswatch to support their revision. Equipment needed for the assessment: pen, pencil, ruler and rubber.	Mathswatch. You can pause the clip to make notes or do any questions asked, then restart the clip to mark your work. If you finish the Mathswatch task you can do more revision on Dr Frost, use the codes on your yellow sheet to find the relevant topics. If you are unsure ask your maths teacher.

Science	Students will sit a 45-minute assessment on all the content covered in Year 8 so far. This includes B2.1 Health and Lifestyle, C2.1 The Periodic Table. RE	The RE assessment is 45 minutes long. There will be questions on the lives of Abraham and Muhammad from the current topic 'Where can wisdom be found for young people today?' Section 1: 10 questions assessing knowledge of key words and definitions. Section 2: Four short answer questions worth 3 marks each assessing knowledge and understanding. Section 3: One long answer question worth 8 marks to assess understanding and evaluation.	Revision materials can be found in the knowledge organiser. Students should start by learning the spellings and definitions of key words using the 'look, cover, write check method.' A link to a Quizlet will be signposted on Satchel I. This can be used to support the learning of key words and definitions. Students should then learn a section of the knowledge organiser at a time using retrieval techniques such as brain dumping and 'tell the story of.'

History	 The assessment will last 45 minutes and be worth a total of 40 marks. It will include questions from Year 7 topics (the Roman Empire and the British Empire) and the current Year 8 topic, Fight For Power (medieval unit only). No notes or books are allowed in the assessment. 	 Students will be issued with a revision guide and will also complete a revision lesson prior to the assessment. MFL	 The Year 8 MFL Assessment will last 45 minutes and covers: Listening Reading Writing and translation from the English into the Target language 	The papers cover topics studied in Year 7 and throughout Year 8 so far. Exercise books and homework booklets (which contain revision guidance and extra revision exercises) should be used to support revision and MFL teachers will attach any materials/revision power points on Satchel one. Music	There will be a 45-minute listening assessment completed in lessons before half term (not in assessment week). Art	One. In Art students have been working on their Mechanical objects project based around Futurism and complementary pairs. For the Year 8 assessment students will be assessed on the work they have completed so far this year. During assessment week or just before, students will have a designated improvement and reflection lesson which will allow them to complete work and act on feedback to improve. Work will then be assessed by the teacher to give a percentage. There is no revision required for art, but students should ensure that homework is complete and presented neatly in their sketchbook.		
Personal Development	There will be a 30-minute assessment completed in lessons. This will consist of short answer knowledge-based questions about Equality and Diversity. This will include the topics of the Equality Act, Sexuality and Gender Reassignment. Students will receive a knowledge organiser to complete for homework as a revision aid for the assessment.
