Parent Voice

Thank you to all parents and carers who contributed to our annual Governor Led Parent Voice Survey. We always value the feedback that is shared with us through this process; 353 parents responded to the survey. We're delighted to share that the results show that the vast majority of families continue to believe that their child is happy and safe at Tapton and that our pastoral support meets the needs of their child.

We would like to thank all respondents for the extended responses. The Leadership Team have taken time to read these and have put together a 'you said, we did' below.

You Said	We Did
Some families would like further guidance on how to revise and prepare for assessments, particularly at Key Stage Three.	This is a whole school priority for next year. Departments are reviewing their current policies on assessment preparation and students will be taught more explicitly on how to revise.
Some families would like homework tasks to align with assessments weeks to further support students to revise.	We are exploring adjustments to our homework policy to accommodate more directed subject specific revision practices.
A few families raised questions about the quality of external cover supervisors.	We have appointed additional internal cover supervisors for September, the majority of whom are qualified teachers.
Some families would like more effective communication with home.	We introduced year group mailboxes for each year group in January. From September each year group will have a non-teaching Learning and Inclusion Coordinator who will work in partnership with the Year Leader to provide additional capacity.
A small number of families asked questions about social bullying.	We have changed how we record incidents to ensure social bullying is highlighted and addressed before it escalates. We have further developed our lessons on Bullying and EDI in all year groups in Personal Development. We will continue to have focused assemblies and form time on British Values.
A small number of families were concerned about the use of discriminatory language in school.	We have adapted our behaviour system to include a category on harassment to ensure we capture uses of discriminatory language and sanction appropriately.
Some families were unsure about the arrangements for access to toilets during the school day.	Students can always access toilets before school, at break, at lunchtime and at the end of the day. The toilets are always locked at lesson changeover to ensure students arrive promptly to lessons and are registered. Sixth formers have access to their own toilet in the Sixth Form area. Access to the toilets during lesson time is allowed in rare and exceptional cases. Concerns are only raised where students regularly ask to use the toilets during lessons because our priority is to maximise learning time. Students with a medical need are always given access to the toilets.
A small number of families asked about in-person Progress Evenings	Parent, carer and staff voice has revealed support for online Progress Evenings. In order to maximise appointment time, which has always been four minutes, teachers always offer the opportunity to ask questions at the start of each appointment. This year we have also introduced year group mailboxes to further improve communication.

Some families asked about the level of support for mental health and well-being.

From September 2024 there will be a restructure of the Inclusion Team, with a Year Leader and Learning Inclusion Coordinator attached to each year group to provide pastoral and emotional health and wellbeing support. Staff have a strong desire and wide range of experience to support students. As a school we do not offer a counselling service but do refer and work with specialist external agencies to ensure the best possible support.

Changes to our punctuality policy

For safeguarding reasons, the DfE has now advised schools to close registers 30 minutes after the start of the morning session. In line with this guidance, from September our registers will close at 9.30am; if your child arrives after the close of the registers (after 9.30) this will be marked as an unauthorised code in the register and will result in the whole session being marked as absent and a one-hour same day after school detention will be issued.

We will continue to work closely with families to ensure support is offered where punctuality is a concern.

As we enter the final weeks of the academic year, life in the Sixth Form is typically busy. First of all, we must say a huge well done to our Year 13 students who have approached their A Levels with real positivity and steadfastness. We now look forward to celebrating the end of the exams at the Leavers' Party at The Mowbray on Friday 28th June 6-10pm. On a more practical level, lanyards and textbooks can be returned to school, and deposits collected where appropriate, on Tuesday 25th and Thursday 27th June between 10 and 11am.

At the beginning of the term, Year 12 families were able to attend our Post-18 Destinations Evening, a hugely informative event supported by colleagues from around the country. We now move to Destinations Day on Wednesday 10th July, where admissions staff from local universities will support students as they begin to complete their UCAS applications and personal statements.
