Being Prepared for the Cold Weather

Smoothwall

To keep students in school safe online we operate a firewall system called Smoothwall which monitors and filters any content that may be deemed harmful or inappropriate.

We have recently seen an increase in alerts. When an alert comes through, we always meet with students to discuss the alert and to ensure their safety. Where students respond inappropriately or it appears their actions are deliberately done to cause offence and/or waste time, we will put sanctions in place. Please continue to discuss online safety with your children to ensure they and other online users are safe.

Pre-loved uniform

At Tapton we offer a pre-loved uniform service. The service is open to all parents and carers of Tapton students. If you would like to request any uniform please email: prelovedschooluniform@taptonschool.co.uk stating the student's name, items required and contact name and number. A member of the uniform team will then contact you to discuss sizing as needed and confirm how items are to be collected. This would normally be by the student at the end of the day. We also have a small number of Tapton Fleeces as part of this.

We do ask for a small donation to cover the cost of washing of 50p/£1 per item, however, this is a voluntary donation.

Personal Development

This half term all students in Key Stage Three will be looking at a variety of different topics. In Year 7 students will be studying puberty and FGM. Year 8 students will be completing their First Give Programme, and one class will win a £1000 for their chosen charity. They will also be looking at criminal exploitation and gang violence. In Year 9 students will spend the half term studying Relationships and Sex education. This will include subjects such as grooming, different types of contraception, safe sex and pregnancy. At Key Stage Four, Year 10 students will be working on equality and diversity, and Year 11 will be focusing on exam revision and strategies for their upcoming GCSEs.

As a whole school we are looking forward to celebrating the Lunar New Year which begins of the 29th January. This year is the year of the snake and there will be activities happening during form time towards the end of the term.

Student Council

Our focus in the Student Council for this year is "belonging", making sure that every student feels like Tapton is their place and that their background is represented. We released a survey asking students about their experiences with diversity and inclusion and based on those responses we are currently organising a belonging club, where students will be able to engage in fun activities relating to a particular culture, with the cultures rotating every few weeks. The idea is to build a stronger community within our school by using team-based activities to encourage unity. We have also restructured elements of the student council to increase our ability to take feedback from the wider student body. Form representatives have been replaced by "student leaders", who are responsible for collecting feedback from their whole year group and relaying it to the Student Council. Student leaders are recognisable by their badges much like Student Council members, so we invite all students to share their feedback with them and us. In December, we presented student opinions and Student Council plans to the Senior Leadership Team, namely calling for improved sports facilities (such as basketball hoops), and a dedicated revision area for KS4 students, monitored by KS5 students. This last suggestion is also something we are hoping to set up in the coming weeks.

Year 8 Subject Choices

Sixth Form Update

We have returned from the Christmas break to a very busy half term for Sixth Formers. We had broken up on a high after the excitement and fun of Charity Week. The students had chosen to raise money for Sheffield Children's Hospital, Cancer Research UK and UNICEF and they amassed a fantastic total of £900, £300 for each charity. Highlights included a Staff vs Student University Challenge, a Cultural Bake Sale and a Guest Lecture on the Science of Santa. Along with this, students came in fancy dress each day; this was a great way to end a busy and eventful term.

Our Year 12 students have just finished their assessment week which will support their subject decisions going forward to Year 13. We have Year 12 Progress Evening on Wednesday 5th February - with appointments now open. Year 12 students planning to take an AS Level this Summer will need to complete the Options Form shared as a Microsoft Form by no later than Friday 7th February. Although students can continue to Year 13 with four subjects, we would strongly advise them to complete at least one subject at AS Level in case they choose to drop a subject next year.

Year 13 are preparing for their Trial Exams in January/February; students have already received their subject specific guidance and timetables.

We have had another bumper year of UCAS applications, with students submitting over 200 applications to a wide range of courses and institutions. We are always proud of the breadth of courses our students go on to and wish them all the best as they await offers of places.

Meanwhile, our Year 12s will be attending the UK Universities and Apprenticeships Fair on 12th March, as they begin to plan their Post-18 Destinations.
