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School Uniform and Equipment

Dear Parents and Carers

We are writing to you before the Summer holiday with an update to our school uniform and equipment policy and expectations. We know many of you will want to take advantage of some of the offers supermarkets and suppliers are currently promoting with regards to school wear and we wanted to ensure you purchase the correct uniform and equipment. We have updated our uniform policy and want to ensure all students are representing Tapton School in the correct smart uniform in September. We understand that this information will be particularly useful for families as they prepare for the return to school on Tuesday 3rd September.

We also offer a pre-loved uniform programme. The programme is open to all parents and carers of Tapton students. If you would like to request any uniform please email <u>prelovedschooluniform@taptonschool.co.uk</u> stating the student's name, items required and contact name and number. A member of the uniform team will then contact you to discuss sizing as needed and confirm how items are to be collected. We do ask for a small donation to cover the cost of washing of 50p/£1 per item, but this is a voluntary donation.

*Permanent exclusion will always be considered for possession or use of these items.	

Please ensure your child is fully equipped and in full uniform for every school day; failure to wear correct uniform will result in a same day lunchtime detention. In order to be fair to our community of students and families, notes from parents and carers will only be accepted in <u>exceptional circumstances</u>; for example, uniform being washed during the school week and being unavailable for the school day will not be an acceptable reason for being out of uniform.

In January 2024 we launched our revised mobile phone and electronic devices policy which has been incredibly successful. Please remember that students cannot have visible phones/earphones/ear pods/cables/smart watches inside the school site at any time. If students bring these items to school they must be turned off and go into school bags before entry onto the site. Students who have a visible device will have it immediately confiscated; items will go into the school safe for all second and subsequent confiscations. Failure to hand in a device will result in a suspension.

Our rules ensure there is clarity, certainty and above all equity for everyone. Upholding these rules ensures our school remains a calm and purposeful learning environment. We fully appreciate your support in maintaining our high standards.
